Roman – a citizen of an ancient empire from Roma (in Italy).

Empire – a group of people who are ruled by an emperor.

Boudica – a Celtic Queen who led a rebellion against the Romans in Britain.

Settlement – a group of people coming to live in one area.

Invasion – to enter as an enemy by force.

Conquest – to win by fighting.

Mosaics – used to decorate buildings, made up of small stones and tiles.

Soldier – a person who fights for their country.

Villa – a large house or estate.

Artefact – an object that tells us about the past.

Chariot Champions – Topic 1

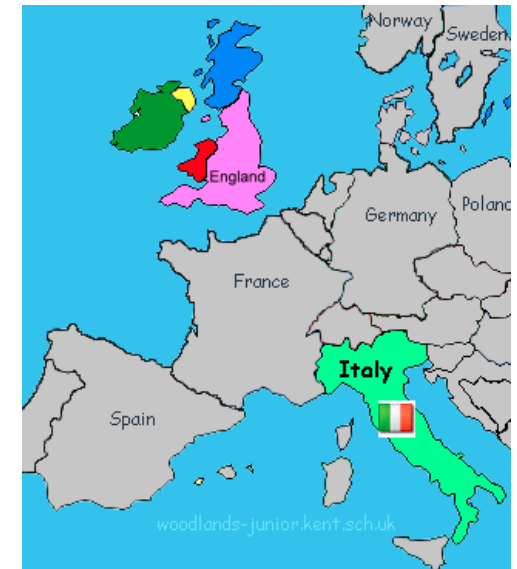


The Romans came to Britain nearly 2000 years ago and changed our country in many ways. Evidence of the Romans can be seen all around Britain!
