




## Broadway First School – Parent Questionnaire Results


The parent questionnaire was sent out to parents on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2020, with questions based largely on Ofsted's Parentview template. The school received 38 responses from a possible 71 families (76 inc pre-school). Results are displayed as pie charts below.

### 1. My child is happy at this school.




An overwhelming majority of 97% believe their children to be happy at the school.

### 2. My child feels safe at this school.




All respondents believe their children feel safe at school.

### 3. The school makes sure its pupils are well behaved.



All respondents agree that school makes sure pupils are well behaved.


### 4. My child has been bullied and the school dealt with the bullying quickly and effectively.



87% of respondents either have children that have not been bullied, strongly agreed or agreed that school dealt with any issues swiftly.


A further 10% neither agreed or disagreed, or did not know. One respondent (2.63%) replied with disagree. The school take all incidents of bullying seriously and urge parents to communicate openly if they have any concerns.

### 5. The school makes me aware of what my child will learn during the year.




97% strongly agreed or agreed that the school do make parents aware of what the children will learn. A new curriculum has been created and is available on the school's website. Each new topic is accompanied with a topic fact sheet. Senior staff will look at how this are can be further developed.

## 6. When I have raised concerns with the school they have been dealt with properly.




The results show that 19% have had no concerns they wished to raise. When concerns are raised, parents agree or strongly agree that they are dealt with properly.

## 7a. Does your child have special educational needs and/or disabilities?




## 7b. If yes, how strongly do you agree with this statement: 'My child has SEND and the school gives them the support they need.'




Parents are in agreement that school provides children with the SEND support they need. This is an area that the school are keen to develop further to improve outcomes for children in this group.

### 8. The school has high expectations for my child.




All respondents agreed or strongly agreed with this statement.

### 10. The school lets me know how my child is doing.




The vast majority of replies agreed or strongly agreed with this statement. One respondent disagreed.

There are currently two parents' evening and an end of year report as is school's statutory requirement. In addition, classes perform assemblies to parents to demonstrate the learning that has taken place in a range of subjects during the term. The introduction of Class Dojo has


provided a clear communication line to teachers if any areas of schooling need to be discussed further.

### 11. There is a good range of subjects available to my child at this school.




The school has created a brand new curriculum for pupils from September 2020. This follows a parent consultation at the beginning of the year. All subjects in the National Curriculum are represented and details of our curriculum are available on the school's webpage.

### 12. My child can take part in clubs and activities at this school.




Whilst Covid-19 has currently impacted on our ability to run clubs, the last few years have seen a range of after-school clubs. During the past 12 months, school has provided clubs such as glow dodgeball, dance, Mad Science, football, French, team games, hockey, gymnastics and archery.

### 13. The school supports my child's wider personal development.



97% agreed or strongly agreed that the school supports the children's wider personal development. The spiritual, moral, social and cultural development (SMSC) curriculum in particular is focussed heavily in this area. Other opportunities such as residential trips, school council and eco clubs promote the school values and British values.

### 14. I would recommend this school to another parent.



89% of respondents would recommend Broadway First School to others. The remaining 11% missed the question. 0% answered no.

### 15. Year 4/5 residential - Given the costs, would you prefer the residential trip on alternate years meaning your child would go either as a Year 4 or Year 5 rather than both?



Half of respondents did not answer this question. 18% would like the trip on alternate years with the remaining 32% favouring every year.

This is quite a complex matter. The trip costs over £200 per child and costs are heavily dependent on the number of children partaking. Families with more than one child in the class come under financial

pressure. School historically needs three staff to go on residential. If the number of children not going on the trip is significant then it causes issues on how they remain in school and who provides their lessons. That said, the trip brings huge positives. Many of our leavers cite the trip as the highlight of their time at the school. It also has a huge impact on personal development in an environment very different to what they are used to. Whilst in the short term this only affects children in Year 4/5, it actually impacts all children in time. The school will continue to canvas parents to obtain interest but future decisions will have to be based on the numbers each trip attracts.

### 16. The school's return since September has been positive meaning parents are confident the required steps are being undertaken to keep our school community safe.



Finally, parents responded positively to the school's response to reopening in September. The measures in place will continue to be reviewed and the school thank parents for their continued support.
