



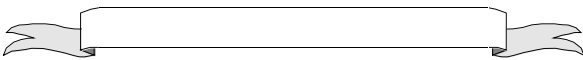

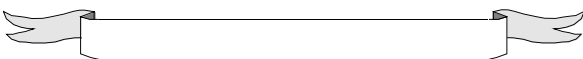

In Science, we looked at what has happened to our magic beans! They have all grown and have roots and a shoot! I wonder what they are going to grow into?!

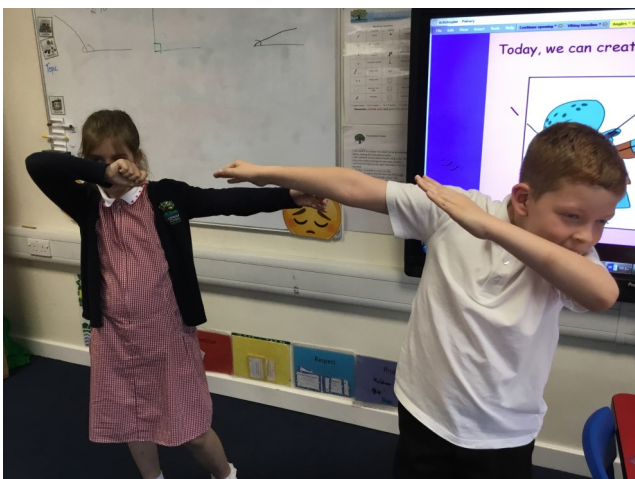


Buzzards
