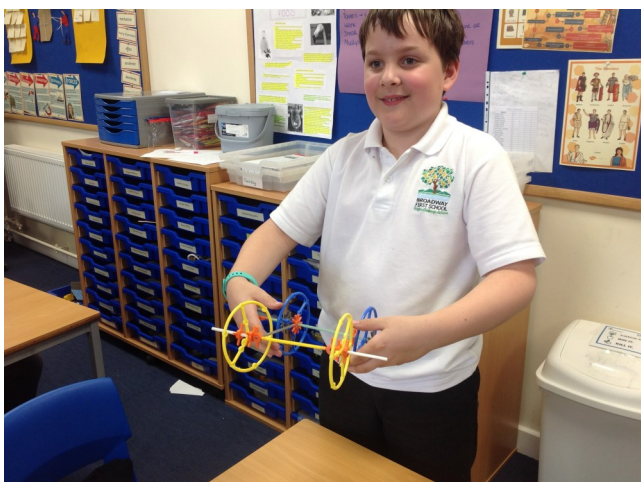


## Turtles
