Messages from Mr Poultney:

I'll start with some really positive news regarding attendance. Since becoming headteacher, I have been working hard with staff to improve our school's attendance figures. Despite all the challenges this term has presented, we are experiencing some really pleasing results. Whole school attendance currently stands at 97.28% compared with less than 96% during the same period last year. In fact, 3 of the last 4 weeks have seen attendance figures over 98%. I would like to personally thank families for their support and it is fantastic to see our attendance rising at a time when many schools across the county are experiencing the opposite. Please help us to maintain this moving forward by ensuring children attend school when they can and arrive on time.

You are probably already aware that teachers are trialling homework through our Class Dojo platform. We are keen to see how parents and children manage learning this way and discover any difficulties you may have. In the event of a bubble closing, the platform would be used to deliver our remote learning plan so by solving any issues now it puts us in a much stronger position should we have to close in the future. Please let us know if you have any difficulties.

Today, saw us raise money for Operation Christmas Child. Mrs Godber has added some more details on page 3 but I'd like to thank you for your support and the children really enjoyed their Christmas themed clothing. A thank you to Miss Pearson who helped to organise this with the school council.

Finally, a reminder that should a child from our school test positive for coronavirus then you should use Class Dojo to alert both myself AND the class teacher. If this happens then I will be required to contact Public Health so that a plan can be made to prevent any spread of infection throughout the wider school community.

Class 1 have been busy with Christmas arts and crafts completing the nativity window, Christmas pictures for Nisa, decorating stockings and creating our own Christmas cards!

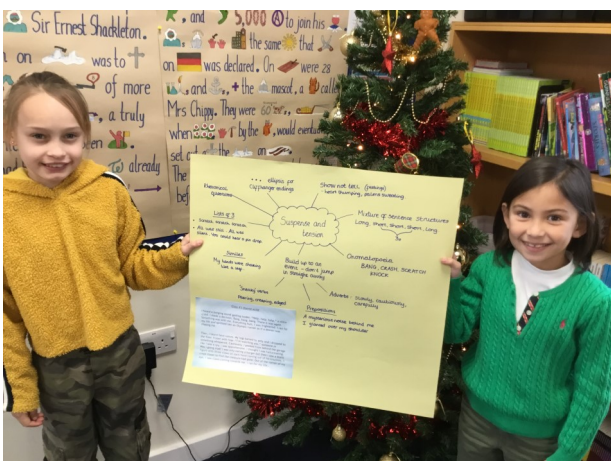


Turtles
