In Class 4, we looked at three different rock types and conducted an experiment to explore how each of the rock types are formed, using white and dark chocolate shavings.



Willow

This week, Willow class have been learning about how people in the Stone Age made their food. We looked at the start of the Neolithic period, when farming was introduced, and Bob came in to help us do some planting of our own! Here we are planting some daffodil bulbs ready for spring. In Maths, we have started looking at addition and subtraction and in English, we have written some fantastic character descriptions.
