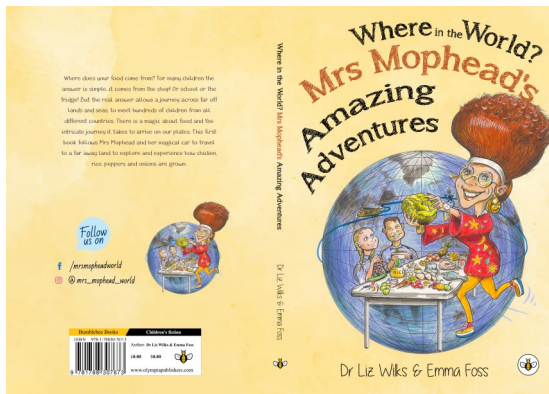
Maple
