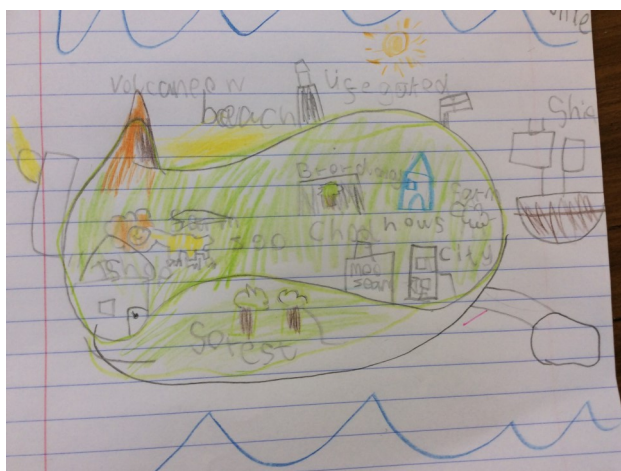


Willow
