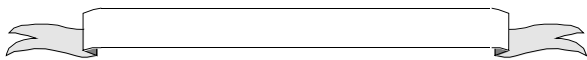

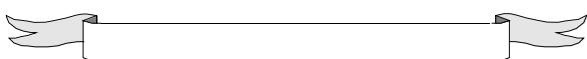

In topic, we have been researching the different shield types used throughout the eras and which was the most effective shape.

This week, we finished off our dances in PE. We used the song, Little April Showers, to create dances that represent the weather. In Maths, we have started a new unit of work – time. We have practiced converting the number of days, weeks and months in a year. In Geography, we have explored the physical geographical features of Mont Blanc (the highest mountain in the Alps).

Maple class has had a good start to the half term welcoming a Ukrainian child as well as learning a few Ukrainian words. Year 1's have worked hard to complete a special mission reading words. We have been working on understanding position and direction in Maths. In Science, we have been looking at what materials objects are made from, which has helped our investigations into finding moving objects during DT.
