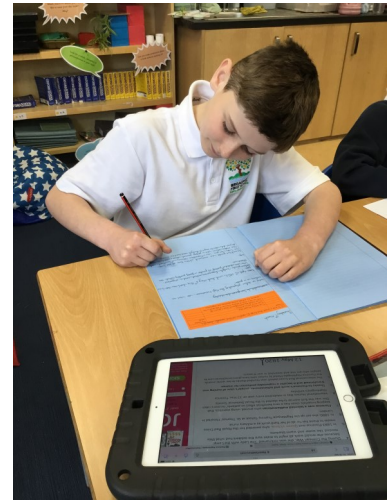




## Tigers
