Looking ahead, the summer term has lots to look forward to including the residential trip, Bikeability, several community events and so much more. Please make a note of the key dates so that you do not miss out.

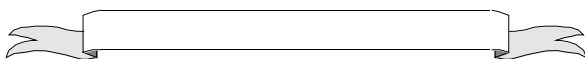
The Youth Club have 2 days of fun planned over the break so please contact them if you would like your child/ren to participate.

All that remains is to say thank you for your support this term and to wish you all an enjoyable Easter.



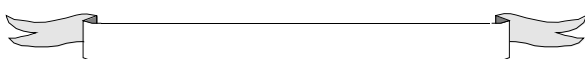

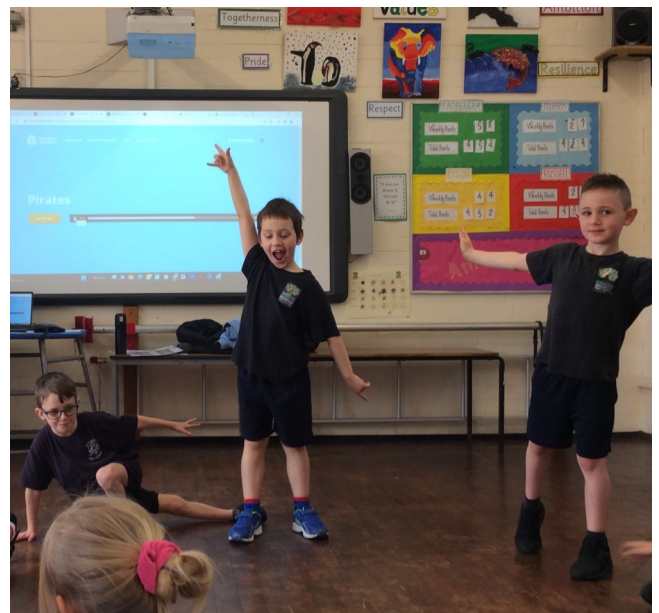


Pandas
