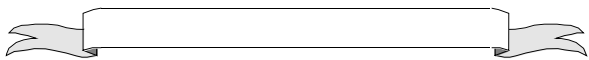

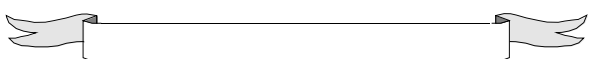

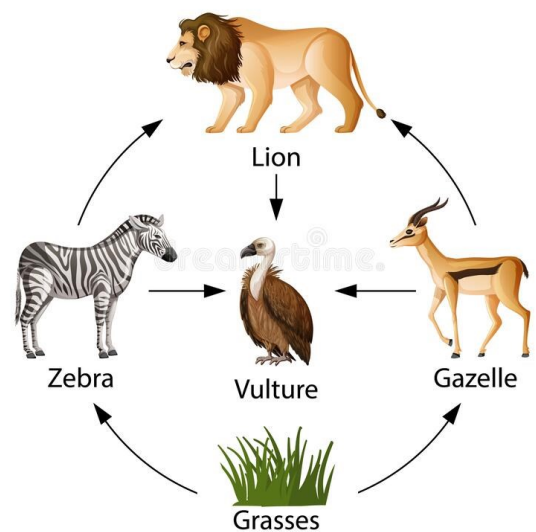
Pandas
