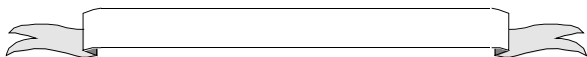

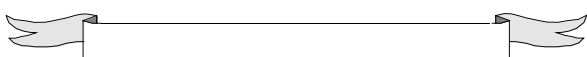

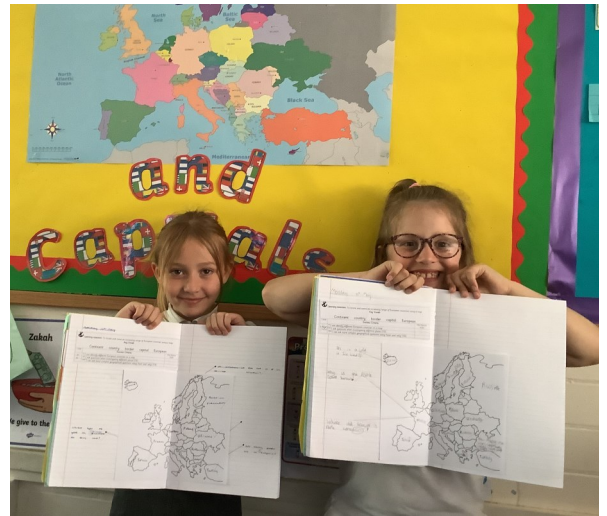


## Tigers

In Tiger Class this week, we have been writing diary entries about our model text, 'Maria's Island'. We have also been using databases in real life situations to plan flights. In Maths, we have been adding and subtracting fractions and solving problems involving them. In our Science experiment, we looked at which surfaces generated the most amount of friction by using Newton meters and our shoes on different materials. Also, after our recent DT topic, some of us have decided to complete some sewing projects at home – aren't they fantastic?!

## Pandas

This week, Pandas have started their new topic, Countries and Capitals! We began by using atlases to locate different European countries before using geographical language to ask questions about the different countries. In Science, we identified how levers, pulleys and gears change a force in preparation for our lesson next week, where we will be making our own simple machines using these. Finally, in Computing we have used Scratch to write our own algorithms using controlled loops. Well done, Pandas!



## Koalas

In Koala Class this week, we have been learning about African animals. We learned about their different habitats and also how they adapt to suit their environment. In SMSC, we have learned all about different jobs - we even dressed up and did some role play in character. Year 2s have been very busy with their tests this week and they have made us very proud - well done to them!

## Tree Frogs

Class 1 has continued to learn about plants in Science; planting beans and discussing what a plant needs to grow. We have started a Bean Diary and written facts about the creatures in the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?' In Maths, Reception children have been securing their understanding of composition of numbers to 10.



## Preschool

In Preschool this week we have shared the story of 'Jack & the Beanstalk, re-enacting the story with props and also went on a listening walk, playing I spy as we went along. In Maths, we have shown confidence subitising skills when stating the value of beans and have linked digits to value up-to 5. We have also replanted our sunflowers into a larger tub and have been observing their growth along with our potatoes.
