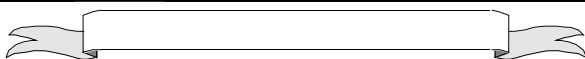

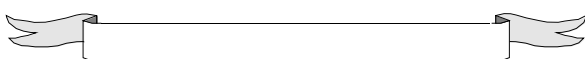

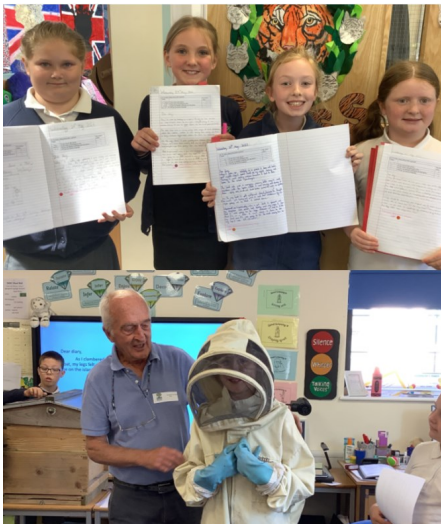

Do bring along a little cash to support the Friends refreshment stand, selling drinks and lollies.

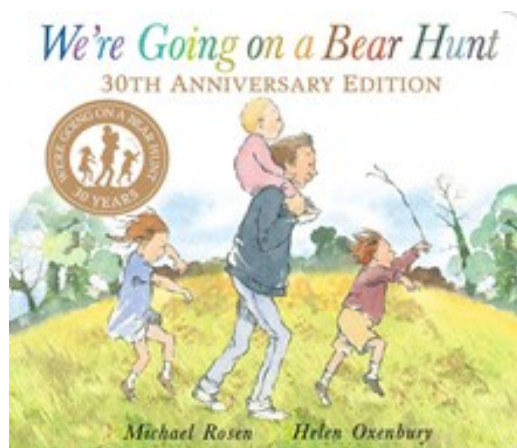
## Bell Boating Regatta Pershore
