Narnia

This week, in Narnia Class, we have been looking at our new key text from *How to Train Your Dragon* and discussing some of the adventurous vocabulary we can use in our own writing. In Science, we drew a results graph and wrote an evaluation for the experiment we set up a couple of weeks ago, looking at how quickly water evaporates in different conditions. In Maths, Year 4 have continued their work on perimeter, whilst Year 5 have been finding the area of compound shapes. On Tuesday, we all enjoyed a dance workshop – especially the ribbon twirling!



Hogwarts



This week, Hogwarts have started their new unit in Maths, length and perimeter, where we have been practising converting measurements involving metres, centimetres and millimetres. In History, we have started our new topic, Legends and Longboats, where we will be learning about the Vikings! This week, we learned about where the Vikings came from and why they invaded Britain. Finally, in PE we have been dancing superstars, learning different ways to move around the room. On Tuesday, we enjoyed a dance workshop where we learnt a routine all together.

Oz

In Oz Class this week, we had our end of topic day designing a lunchbox fit for an explorer. The class worked in groups to design and make the lunchbox, before testing to see if they could hold food and were waterproof. We also painted our clay bird which we made before half term. We had a great time using paints to make them bright and colourful. In Maths, Year 2 were looking at the value of coins.



Wonderland

This week, we explored different types of glasses, (sunglasses, safety glasses, goggles, snorkel, reading glasses) in our unit 'Let's look at products' for DT. We talked about the similarities and differences between features of the glasses and evaluated these, recording our ideas in our floor book. In Maths, Reception children have learnt to identify two parts that are equal and that two equal parts make a whole that is double, practising the STEM sentence e.g. '6 is made of 3 and 3, 3 and 3 make 6' for each double to 5. We have also introduced our new topic 'Where I live', and recorded our ideas on what this might look like. Well done Wonderland!

Laugh 'n' Learn Pre-School

In our Laugh 'n' Learn Preschool this week, we have been looking at squares and rectangles. We looked at a range of pictures and chatted about what shapes we could see and made our own artwork, using different sized rectangles and squares. In Phonics, we have played rhyming picnic, rhyming soup and have enjoyed a range of rhyming stories including Julia Donaldson's 'Rhyming Rabbit'. We were extremely lucky in forest school and saw a large number of frogs in the pond laying frogspawn and even heard the male frogs croaking!! Great week Preschool!!
