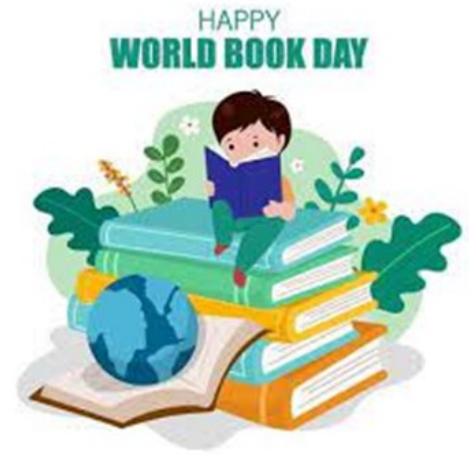
## Oz
