It's been another exciting week at Broadway First School. Year 5 had a visit from two of the middle school staff who were on hand to answer all the questions the children had relating to them moving on in July. On Wednesday, Year 1 and 2 participated in the cluster Multi-Skills Festival. This was held at Ashton-under-Hill and provided an opportunity for the children to try out lots of different events alongside some of our neighbouring schools. Everyone had a great time.

Elsewhere, Year 1 have been undertaking their statutory phonics screening. This is a national screening meaning that every Year 1 in the country has been screened this week. We will share the results once they are confirmed within the end of school report.

Year 4s also had their statutory screening for times tables this week. Again, all Year 4s nationally are screened although there is no pass rate issued by the Department for Education for this screening.

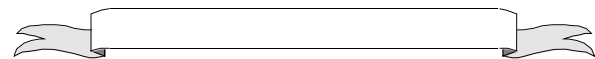

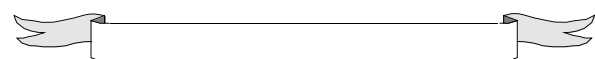

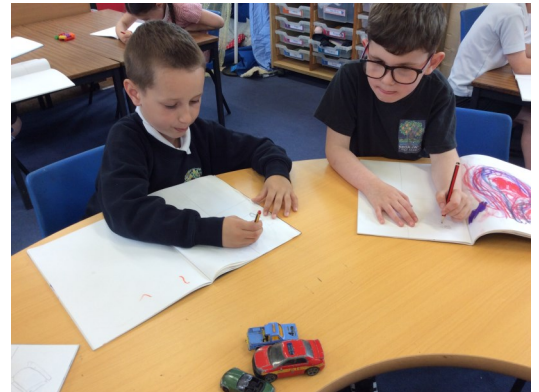


Hogwarts

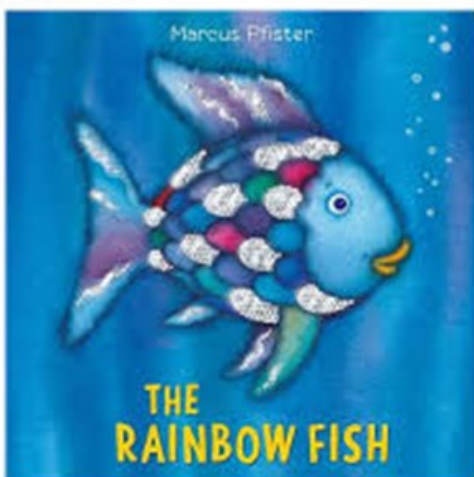
Oz

This week in Oz Class, we have been very busy. In Topic, we looked at old and new toys and looked at their material and colour to help us decide if they were from the past or not. In Science, we carried out an investigation to answer the big question – 'Are all the leaves from the same tree the same size?' Yesterday, we created some art work based on the artist Kathy Hildbrandt, who is known for drawing still life pictures of toys. We did our own still life sketching and I was so impressed with the whole class! We also really enjoyed the multi-skills sports event at Ashton Under Hill playing fields on Wednesday.

This week Wonderland Class has been learning about the life cycle of a sea turtle. We made our own collage of a sea turtle and ordered pictures of their life cycle. Reception children have also been retelling the story of 'The Rainbow Fish', and writing out the different sections in their daily literacy challenge. In Maths, Reception children have started the unit, 'Sharing and Grouping' and have begun to use these skills to share the amount equally in different ways, recognising when it is unequal. We have loved playing with the water and sea creatures in our continuous provision too!

In Laugh & Learn Preschool this week, we have shared stories based around pirates and have made our own pirate hats. In Maths, we have looked at tall and short and have compared ourselves to each other and measured items with Lego to find out which item was the tallest or shortest. 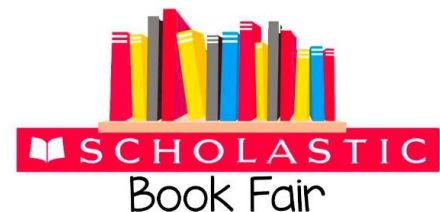
