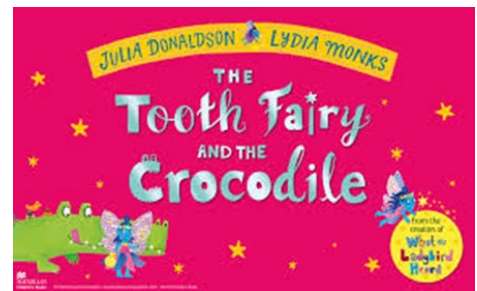
## Wonderland

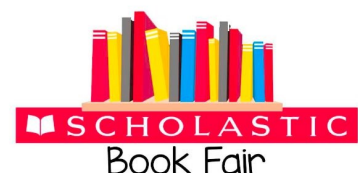
