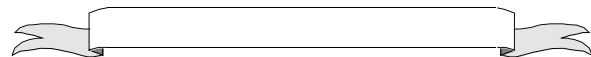

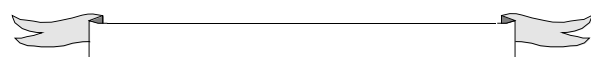

We are looking ahead to a busy few weeks as we head towards half term. Next week sees our first Parents' Evening sessions of the year on Monday and Tuesday. Donaldson (Class 1)

This week Donaldson class have discussed the Rule of Law and how this relates to the rules in our classroom and school. We also enjoyed exploring ICT through beebots, talking about objects that use electricity and how to be safe with electrical items. Reception children started a new maths unit 'Measures and patterns' and have used comparative language to talk about size, mass, capacity and have begun to explore patterns. We read the book 'Going on a bear hunt' and used this repeating language to make our own obstacle courses. The children were creative and made it into a 'hedgehog' course! Well done Donaldson class!



Dahl (Class 2)

We've had a brilliant week in Dahl Class. On Monday morning, we walked into Broadway as part of our Geography fieldwork focussing on our local area. We loved spotting and counting the different facilities, making a tally chart to show which vehicles we saw and sketching maps of our journey. It was lovely to go out and about together. Following our return, we wrote a recount of our morning, analysed the information we'd collected and created bar charts and pictograms to show this. In Science, we observed that our cress seeds inside are so far growing much quicker than our cress seeds outside! We also looked at different seeds and plants and concluded that bigger seeds do not make bigger plants. Well done everyone.

Seuss (Class 3)

This week in Seuss, we have been making Stonehenge clay models. We looked at how Stonehenge was built, and where the stones came from. We looked at maps and discussed how heavy the stones were, and how tricky it must have been moving them to their final destination. Thank you for encouraging your children to read at home, the Dojo points are adding up and the benefits are being seen. Well done class 3!



Morpurgo (Class 4)

This week in Morpurgo Class, we have been using column addition to add together increasingly larger numbers, including two 4-digit numbers (or larger in Year 5)! We have been concentrating hard to ensure we make the exchange in the correct column to calculate the correct answer. In Science, we explored why different animals have different skeletons, matching the endoskeleton to the correct animal. Finally, in History this week, we have continued our learning about Stonehenge, and explored how the Neolithic people, might have transported the giant Bluestones from the Preseli Hills in Wales to Salisbury Plain... we used Google maps to identify how far this really was!

Laugh 'n' Learn Preschool

In Laugh 'N' Learn Pre-school this week we have continued our topic of pattern repeats and have shared the story "The Little Red Hen". We went bug hunting in the forest school, finding a variety of mini beasts and we have joined the Reception children who were enjoying the story of "Stuck".
