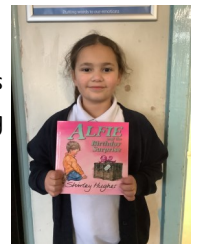
Message from Mr Poultney:

Donaldson (Class 1)

We then, rounded the day off in Forest School, building our own Stone Age shelters (cave paintings included). On Tuesday, we started our new topic – The Land of Hope and Glory! We learned the eight compass points and used these to compare different locations in the UK. Finally, in Maths we have been busy identifying the multiples and factors of different numbers.
