Donaldson (Class 1)

In Class 1 this week, we have enjoyed beginning to make our own felt winter hats by cutting and folding and tying pieces of material. We have had a great time learning about Chinese New Year, dancing with ribbons, dressing up, eating noodles and prawn crackers and making dragons. We talked about similarities that festivals and celebrations had and the children were able to recall learning from our previous topic. We have also enjoyed (attempting) to make 'pizza faces' linked to our science learning this week about our eyes, mouth and hair.



Dahl (Class 2)

This week in Dahl Class, we learned how real Historians find out about what happened in the past and then considered what sources would be best to learn about the Great Fire of London. We thought about non-fiction books, Samuel Pepys diaries, Google, artefacts and someone from the time. In DT, we explored pop-up and lift the flap books, we talked about which parts moved, how they moved and what mechanisms we could see that made them move in this way. In Computing, we explored different ways to take photos and record our voices with technology, we chose an iPad as the best device to do this with. Well done everyone.

Suess (Class 3)

This week in Suess Class, we have been in Broadway interviewing visitors and creating a tally chart. This has helped us to create bar graphs to explain what effect an increase in population has had on the village. We have looked at the human features and this will help us to compare other locations within the UK.

In Maths, we have been looking at Area, whilst in French we have been learning how to describe our family, such as eye colour. It has been a great week!



Morpurgo (Class 4)



Class 4 have enjoyed creating their mystery stories this week after reading The London Eye Mystery. The children have been trying to ensure there's plenty of suspense for the reader. In maths, the children have analysed data using line graphs and visited Broadway to collect data on the different types of buildings and facilities on offer. I wonder if this data can be used to create a graph? The children also visited Forest School where they made Bug Hotels to attract a range of wildlife to our school grounds. Well done everyone.

Laugh 'n' Learn Preschool

In Preschool this week, we have been busy and have been very interested in crafting freely on the arts table, selecting our own resources to invent and construct! In maths, we have enjoyed consolidating learning numbers 1 to 3 in the unit 'Move and Label'. We continue to practise our early phonological skills through oral blending simple CVC words, exploring how different objects sound when tapped with a beater and exploring loud and quiet sounds. We enjoyed watching 'My First Chinese New Year' on CBeebies!
