

Donaldson (Class 1)

This week in Donaldson class we have enjoyed British Science Week. The focus was 'Change and Adapt'. We looked at different habitats around the world and discussed the animals that live in these habitats and how they have adapted to live. We completed the activity 'Lets create an animal' where we created an animal, for example, an animal with a long beak, a tail and some googly eyes to adapt to a given environment. In PE we did the activity 'Deep Sea yoga discovery' and combined physical movement with learning about marine life and their adaptations, promoting both physical wellness and environmental awareness. We also loved seeing the tadpoles hatching in the pond! In maths, we have continued our unit on 'Building 9 and 10' where we played dice games and made numbers to 10 using 10's frames. We loved competing in the Holi run, designing our own shirt, learning a Bollywood dance and creating Rangoli patterns.



Dahl (Class 2)

This week, we really enjoyed going out into the village to do some Geography fieldwork. We took our sketchbooks and walked a little way up the Cotswold Way footpath. We took time to sketch our surroundings and discuss which geographical features we could see. In the afternoon, we then compared Broadway and Malawi, Africa by finding a range of human and physical features. As part of British Science Week, we have made our own wormeries and we will be observing the changes to these over the next couple of weeks. We have also looked at animal adaptations and learned more about this by matching animals to their characteristics and doing some 'deep sea yoga'. Well done everyone!

Suess (Class 3)

This week, we have looked at the digestive system and its purpose. Thank you for all of the bottles! As it is science week, we also looked at astronauts and the effect this has on their body. We really found it fascinating how they go to the toilet in space and how to tell if we need to hydrate more. In computing, we used Micro:bits to create an algorithm, whilst looking at inputs, outputs, and debugging any errors that occurred. Finally, in English, we have been focusing on paragraphs and subheadings. We can't wait to share with you our work. Well done Suess!



Morpurgo (Class 4)

As part of British Science Week, Morpurgo Class have taken the opportunity to explore microplastics and their effects on the ocean and wildlife. We used sand to represent the microplastics, and different materials to try and create the best filter to help clean ocean water. In Computing, we have used the micro-bits again, writing our own programmes using selection. We were able to control the micro-bits using 'if...then...' statements. Finally, in History, we enjoyed learning about the River Nile, and did some research to identify how important it was to the Ancient Egyptian civilization. Well done, Morpurgo!



Laugh 'n' Learn Preschool

In preschool this week we loved reading the story 'Where the wild things are' and drew our own 'Wild thing' in drawing club. We loved junk modelling our own animals and making the life cycle of a frog using mixed media, such as bubble wrap and egg cartons. We have begun to learn the story 'The three Billy goats gruff' using signalong and have learnt the repeated refrains! In maths, unit 'Match, talk push and pull' we have used blocks to create creations and select shapes appropriately, such as flat surfaces for building, a triangular prism for a roof.
