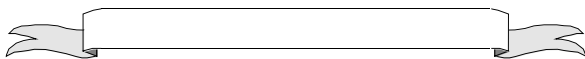

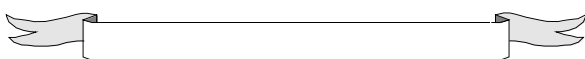

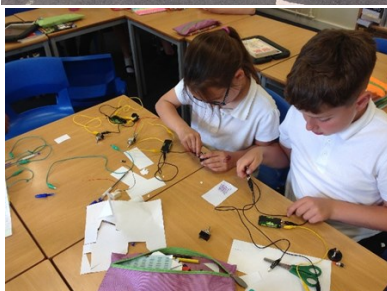
Dahl (Class 2)

We loved making our salads – chopping the items and carefully layering the different ingredients to make a delicious salad. In French, we practised how to ask for items at the shop and 'shopkeepers' around the classroom had to carefully listen to our request and only handing over the item if we had asked for it correctly! Morpurgo (Class 4)

In French this week, we have been learning to say what we eat and drink for breakfast and lunch. We have also been learning the difference between feminine and masculine words, identifying when to use 'un' or 'une'. In our Science and DT lessons, we have continued learning about electrical circuits, looking at complete and incomplete circuits, and applied this learning to our DT project, where we are designing board games with an electrical function.
