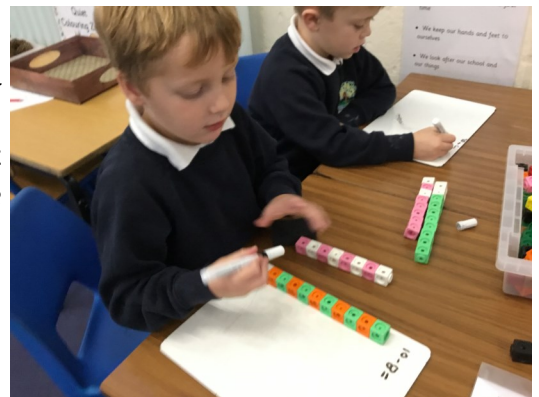
In PE, we loved creating different shapes and balances with our bodies and learned some new jumps, such as star jumps and tuck jumps. We even performed a sequence of these for our friends!
