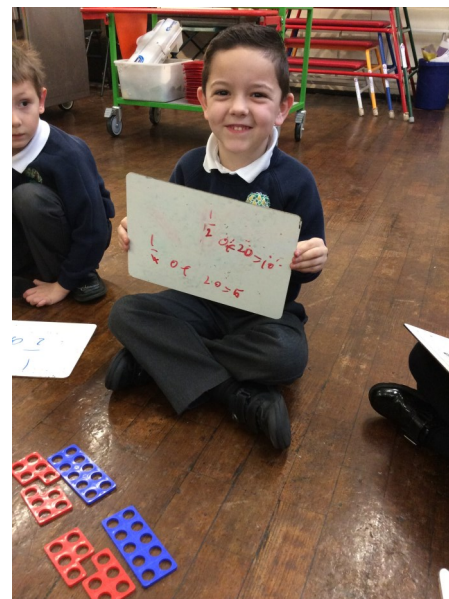
Owls
