The United Reformed Church has their annual Christmas tree display on show and our tree was decorated today. The children have created the decorations so pop along for a look between now and Christmas.




#### **Tigers**

In Tiger Class this week, we have been writing adventure stories in English, adding dialogue using inverted commas. In Maths, we have been using our rounding skills to estimate and then checking our answers with our column methods; we also used our column methods when playing Permission Mission in e-safety. We have made some super predictions in Science whilst planning our investigation to see which material will have the least amount of friction to launch our lifeboat into the sea the quickest.



#### Pandas

On Monday, Panda Class celebrated the end of their topic 'Chariot Champions'. We demonstrated our fantastic knowledge of the Roman era through creating our own leaflets that identified how the Romans influenced life in Britain. This week, we have also started our new Science unit — Forces and Magnets. We have used our working scientifically skills to plan an investigation to explore how objects move on different surfaces. Finally, in our E-Safety lesson this week, we identified our own digital footprints. We then explored these further through identifying age appropriate games and apps and considered why some of these apps and games have an age rating. Super work, Pandas!

In Koala Class this week, we have finished our 'Through my Window' topic. As we were unable to go on our village walk due to the stormy weather, we made Broadway out of blocks and Lego instead!
